Beating the winter blues

It's that time of the year again when winter feels like it will never end! While the cold weather and lack of sunlight can leave you feeling rather blue, it's not just humans who get the winter blues!

Here are some tips to help keep your cat warm, cosy and happy during the colder months.



- Whether inside or outside, make sure your cat's bedding is raised off the floor and away from cold drafts. Fill your cat's bed with warm, dry blankets that are washed regularly. You could also try placing a hot water bottle (with warm not hot water) or heat pack into your cat's bedding for some extra warmth.
- If your cat spends most of its time outside, make sure they have somewhere warm and comfortable to retreat to that's in a position where they feel secure and cosy, and away from the seasonal elements.
- Don't forget that young, elderly and sick animals will feel the cold more than others, so are best kept indoors in the colder months.
- You'll probably notice your cat's appetite will increase during winter. This is especially true in outside cats who will use more energy to keep warm. Keep a close eye on your cat's weight ensuring they are nourished, but not overfed from too many winter snacks.
- It may be tempting to turn into a couch potato during the winter months, but exercising your cat is still important. Keep them fit with interactive toys! Laser pointers are a great way to get your kitty moving!
- Open the curtains during the day to let the sun come in and move furniture so your cat can take advantage of the warmth.
- If your pet is struggling to get out of bed then it could be a sign of arthritis or an age related disease. Often these problems are provoked by cold weather so make sure you visit your vet for six-monthly check-ups particularly if your pet is showing signs of ageing.

When did you last check your cat's microchip details?

Microchips are an excellent way of identifying your cat, so it's vital that your details stay up-to-date and your alternative contacts are people you trust with your cat's life!

If you haven't checked or updated your cat's microchip details recently, here are some simple tips to help you get started. Your cat's safety – as well as your peace-of-mind – depends on it!

Getting your cat scanned for their microchip details

If you don't have your cat's microchip number on file, call your local vet to check that they have a microchip scanner before going; if not, ask them for the details of the nearest microchip scanner facility. Request the microchip number and the name of the register that your pet is listed with (there are several) – your vet may even be able to update your details on the spot.

Which microchip registry is your cat is on?

There are many microchip registries. To check which registry your cat is listed with, use the following steps:

1. Visit www.petaddress.com.au and enter your cat's microchip number. This site hosts a search engine to search multiple registers at once. If you get a result, it will give you the contact details for the register that your cat is listed with.
2. If you do not have success finding your cat's record using petaddress.com.au, you have two options:
 - a. Contact each register individually with your cat's microchip number to see if they have your record; or
 - b. Take your cat to a vet with a microchip scanner and have the microchip scanned for the number and register.

You have your cat's microchip and registry details... now what?

If you have your cat's registry details, simply contact the register and ask them to update your file. Remember to update your details with your local council as well. Make sure your address, phone numbers and alternative contact person's details are correct and up-to-date.
